# PROBATION BOARD FOR NORTHERN IRELAND

- Aim: Our aim is to help reduce crime and the harm it causes
- Mission: Our mission is to integrate offenders successfully into the community by reducing re-offending
- Vision: Our vision is to have the confidence and support of the courts and the community, so that we can successfully supervise high risk offenders in the community

#### WHO WE ARE...

- PBNI is a Non-Departmental Public body that was created in 1982 by the Probation Board (NI) Order.
- 12 Board members and ~350 staff (FTE)
- Approximately half of these are Probation Officers based across the region
- Remainder include Managers, Probation Service Officers, Psychologists and Admin
- PBNI plays a key part of the criminal justice system working with police, prisons, courts, communities as well as victims of crime.

## WHAT WE DO ...

- Assess risk, manage offenders, address offending behaviour
- Supervise approximately 4,300 offenders at any one time
- Provide around 730 reports every month to the courts &/ parole commissioners
- Pre Sentence Reports: background, suitability and additional requirements
- 175,000 hours a year of Community Service
- Deliver various offending behaviour programmes
- Liaison with community services i.e. health, housing, employment



## TYPES OF LICENCES

#### MENTAL HEALTH DISPOSALS

- Under the Mental Health [Northern Ireland] Order 1986), there are four potential sentencing options if deemed 'not fit to stand trial' or found 'not guilty by reason of insanity':
  - Supervision and Treatment Order (STO)
  - Hospital Order
  - Guardianship Order
  - Absolute Discharge

#### PPANI PROCESS

- Public Protection Arrangements for Northern Ireland
- Specified offences
- Multi-agency (PBNI, PSNI, Social Work/Trust)
- Category 1, 2, 3 (3 highest risk)
- Inescapable voluntary

#### PREVENTION ORDERS

- SOPO/SHPO sexual offences or sexual harm prevention order
  - Court order requested by the police or Courts
  - Conditions which are necessary to protect the public
  - Prohibitions e.g. internet access, contact with children, certain types of jobs
  - Can last indefinitely
  - Unannounced visits by police
  - It's an offence to breach (max 5 years)
- VOPO violent offences prevention order
  - Convicted of a specified offence e.g. manslaughter, wounding, threats to kill
  - Prohibitions e.g. in relation to seeing other people
  - Lasts between 2-5 years
- ASBO anti-social behaviour order
  - PSNI, Councils and NIHE
  - From the age of 10

### **PROGRAMMES**

Accredited

Group work programmes, developed and audited by NOMS/HMPPS

Brief Interventions

Lower level, lower risk, 1-1 e.g. coping skills, goal setting

**PPRP Trust** 

Promoting Positive Relationships Programme, for unadjudicated males, concerns regarding domestic abuse

# LINKS TO MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES

- PBNI Psychologists are allocated to all Forensic MH & LD Teams
- Regular attendance at team meetings
- Share relevant information as appropriate
- Co working complex cases open to both services
- Joint assessments
- GPs gatekeepers to primary care services

### STAGES OF INPUT:

- Pre Sentence Stage
  - Assessment of suitability for community disposal
  - Offending history
  - Compliance and engagement
  - Previous periods of supervision or custody
  - Liaison with other professionals involved i.e. psychiatrist/GP
  - Additional requirements i.e. addiction/mental health services/programmes
  - Risk management meetings

- Case Management Consultation/Assessment
  - Consultation at request of Probation Officer
  - Range from one off to ongoing/longer term
  - Assessment if deemed appropriate:
    - Collateral information often available
    - Highest risk and need prioritised

Comprehensive Formulation

1-1 or group work with Psychology or Programmes team Advice, Guidance or Individualised work plan

**Outcomes** 

Amendment to, breach of or revocation of order

Referral to Forensic Team other service. Assessment letter to GP request referral to services
